Ministerial Matters

Dear friends,

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I hope you are well. I am writing this letter in the middle of November and according to a local shop it is only 43 sleeps until Christmas! As we approach once again the celebration of our Lord's Nativity, we do so in a time of great uncertainty — within our nation and across the world.

Even within the Church, there is a great deal of anxiety about the future of local congregations as well as anxiety about the future of our denomination.

And yet, as Christians, we look forward in faith and with hope. We know the end of the story. At the appointed time, God will re-make the heavens and the earth. A heavenly city, the new Jerusalem, will come down to earth and God will make his home with us. His Son. our Lord Jesus Christ, has been raised from the dead. He now sits on the throne as Lord of Lords and King of Kings. One day every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Two thousand years ago, things also seemed pretty bleak. God's people had been waiting for the promised Messiah for a long time. Back then, the world was ruled by tyrants like Caesar and King Herod. Many people had given up hope. And yet, because he loved the world so much, the Father sent his Son into the world. The Word became flesh and dwelt among us - coming to us in the form a helpless baby, born into poverty, with no place to rest other than a stable.

In the Holy Gospel according to St Luke, we are told that when the prophet John the Baptist was born, his father, Zechariah, held him up and said over him:

And thou, child, shalt be called the prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways;

To give knowledge of salvation unto his people by the remission of their sins,

Through the tender mercy of our God; whereby the dayspring from on high hath visited us,

To give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into

the way of peace.

I have always loved the phrase - 'the dayspring from on high'.

The coming of Jesus is like the arrival of a long-awaited dawn.

His advent (or coming) dispels the darkness and chases away the shadows. His light lasts forever – it cannot be extinguished.

And so, this Christmas, let us look forward in faith and with great hope. For the dayspring on high has visited us and will come again. He first came as the Christ Child lying in the manger. He will return in glory as King of creation! In him all things are made new. All things in heaven and on earth are reconciled in him and through him. And so, we have nothing to fear – for if Christ is with us, who can stand against us?

When Christmas comes, I hope it is a time of blessing for you and those you love. I pray that you would know that peace of the Christ Child – the peace that this world cannot give. The peace that passes all understanding. The peace that can only come only through knowing the Prince of Peace.

In the words of St Paul:

Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all.
The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about
anything, but in every situation, by prayer and

hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

You are always in my prayers. May God bless you and keep you – may the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace. Amen.

Remembrance Service Poppy Display

All the poppies (over 500 in total) had been knitted by members of the congregation and friends, with wool donated by other congregation members.

A small team gathered all the finished poppies together and hand stitched them onto a net backing in the case of the drape coming down from the pulpit to the communion table (above left).

So many poppies had been knitted that it was then decided to add the remainder to the rustic cross that is often on display in the Church (above right).

Our grateful thanks go to all those who helped to make this display a reality.

The main poppy display drape has now been safely stored away ready for future use.
